ADMINISTRATION

System Redesign Update: On April 13th, the Transit Board took the final step to approve the System Redesign Plan. Copies of the adopted plan are available in the break room as well as at www.cyride.com/system-redesign.

Staff will be developing an implementation plan over the summer and then begin working toward executing the following service changes next year as follows:

- May 2018: Yellow, Gray, Pink and Innovative Transit Service Zone
- <u>August 2018:</u> Red, Cherry, Purple, Lilac, Gold (new), Blue, Brown, Green, Orange, Peach

The Cardinal, Plum, Aqua and Silver routes will remain unchanged. Some of the activities that staff will be working on over this next year as a result of this plan, and the staff member(s) responsible for its completion, are as follows:

Award of Excellence Received: CyRide received the "Award of Excellence" from the Federal Transit Administration's Region VII Office for the "Highest Ridership of 6,785,479 riders and the Highest Increase in Ridership of 64,880 Rides Among Public Transit Systems in Iowa from 2015-2016. Sheri Kyras, Transit Director, received the award during the Iowa Public Transit Association annual meeting in Des Moines on June 1, 2017. (Sheri K.)

2017 Triennial Review Results: Every three years for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) examines CyRide's performance and adherence to current FTA requirements and policies. Federal contractors are hired to scrutinize every aspect of our operation from procurement and maintenance to our fare structure and employment practices.

This year's triennial review began with a 'desk review' of compliance with 17 areas including: Financial Management, Technical Capacity, Maintenance, ADA, Title VI, Procurement, DBE, Legal, Satisfactory Continuing Control, Planning, Public Comment, Half Fare, Charter Bus, School Bus, Security, Drug Free Workplace/Drug & Alcohol, and EEO. While this review is not an "audit", the effort needed to document compliance with federal regulations is certainly equal of an audit. CyRide submitted a document over 200 pages of answers to prepared questions and the documents to support those answers for this portion of the review!

After the desk review was completed, the federal contractor then visited Ames in May to perform a two-day intensive on-site review asking additional follow-up questions for areas of concern. CyRide received two findings detailed below in which they must respond with a schedule to correct these deficiencies by October 3, 2017:

- Planning/Program of Projects (POP) –No current agreement with metropolitan planning organization (MPO)
- Drug Free Workplace/Drug and Alcohol Program Drug and alcohol contractors not properly monitored for their D&A program

FTA stated within the exit conference that any transit agency with less than four findings is an "outstanding outcome" and CyRide is to be congratulated for this result.

OPERATIONS

National Roadeo Results: Kevin Gries APTA recently competed the in International Bus Roadeo 40ft. bus division in Reno, NV, where he placed 19th out of 61 contestants This was Kevin's second time competing at the national level and out of a possible 700 points he 602. We would like received to congratulate Kevin on this accomplishment and thank him for his excellent representation of CyRide and the State of Iowa at this national event! (Sheri K. & Barb N.)

In winning the large bus division, Kevin will compete next on the behalf of CyRide and the State of Iowa in Tampa, Florida in early May 2018 at the APTA convention. With Nathan winning the small bus division, he will be competing in a "yet-to-be-determined location" in June 2018 for the Community Transportation Association of America (CTAA) bus competition. CyRide Professional Driver of the Year: Dave Happe was selected as CyRide's Professional Driver of the Year, with an outstanding performance record and recognition by his peers. Dave received a "Professional Driver of the Year" certificate and pin for his achievement at an award banquet dinner at the annual IPTA meeting on Friday, June 2, 2017. The following accolades were read at the dinner:

Dave has been employed as a Transit Driver with CyRide for the past 5 ½ years; is a very dependable and conscientious employee and an inspiration, role model and mentor to many drivers within the organization. He has also earned a 4 year Safe Driver Award from the National Safety Council and is a training instructor for CyRide's new drivers. He shows a sincere interest in the new drivers and is highly regarded by them as a source of knowledge and expertise. A few comments that were noted on the ballot nomination forms from his peers were: "Dave's indomitable spirit (and cookies) give us inspiration to do our best even on the most difficult



days"; "Dave always has a positive attitude and is willing to help"; Many mentioned how "happe" he is.

One thing that can always be counted on with Dave is that every day he has a smile on his face and greets every employee and passenger he interacts with kindly. This kind of thoughtfulness and kindheartedness has made CyRide a better place. Dave is a valuable member of CyRide and a great example of a dedicated transit employee. Congratulations Dave! Time off Without Pay: The Labor Management Committee has recently come to an agreement about the number of hours employees can have time off without pay. Beginning July 1, 2017, drivers will be able to take a maximum of 40 hours of time off without pay during the fiscal year, unless prior approval is obtained from the Director of Transit, Sheri Kyras. It was agreed that certain situations would not count toward the 40 hour maximum, including:

- Banked Time Requests
- Interviews (other rules still apply to these)
- Exams
- Swaps

It will be each employee's responsibility to monitor their own time off, including any limitations such as the 40 hour maximum of time off without pay. In efforts to help individuals monitor this, a listing will posted with the accrual listing in the hallway by the breakroom at the end of each month. It will be very important that Requests for Time Off (RTO's) have the enough information listed, specifically the situations that are excluded from the 40 hour count. This information may be marked in the "reason" box of the RTO form, so it isn't listed in the payroll system incorrectly. If you have any questions do not hesitate to ask! (Julie and Rob J)

School Year Schedule Changes: School year schedule changes for August 2017 have been developed and are currently at the printer to be incorporated into our schedule. The changes are as follows:

- #6 Brown North: The #6 Brown route from the Core into campus was modified. Many drivers suggested to look at the time it took to travel northbound into campus from the Core. Not only did it take additional time than anticipated to travel through the Core parking lot, but a new signal light on University Boulevard near Highway 30 made the travel time longer as well. In addition, staff anticipates more ridership on the south end of the Brown route due to the new apartments being built south of Wessex as well as the Core building being more heavily utilized. All times from Wilson to the Mall were all delayed by two minutes.
- #9 Plum: The time points were observed on the #9 Plum route from campus out to the endpoint per a suggestion that waiting at the Memorial Union as well as along South 16th were areas of concern. As a result, times were adjusted to help keep the buses moving through these two time point areas.
- #7 Purple: The #7 Purple route endpoint will be extended further west on Mortensen Road this fall. CyRide buses will no longer have to turn around at the intersection of Mortensen Road and Miller Avenue as a new bus turnaround is being constructed just south of Clemens Blvd. The new turnaround should look similar to the #2 Green endpoint.

Bessey Hall: The Bessey Hall bus stop is slated to reopen mid-August and as a result
all transfer points on the school year schedule will go back to Bessey Hall instead of the
current MacKay Hall. When this happens, MacKay and Agronomy Hall bus stops will
close once again. The fall schedule is being modified with this change.

Thank you to everyone that provided suggestions or stopped by to share your thoughts on our current bus system and schedule. I really appreciate all the comments in how to make our service better. However, keeping any changes and suggestions within the budget can be a challenge but it is a challenge that I enjoy working through. (Rob J.)

HIRING AND TRAINING

Referral Program: Please continue to refer qualified applicants to apply to be a driver! Current employees who refer someone to be a driver receive a \$500 bonus after the referred person works just 400 hours! Since the implementation of this bonus program, 7 employees have received this bonus and 4 more are getting closer to receiving the bonus. Simply tell the person applying to put your name down on the application—it is that easy!

New Hires: There are some new faces here at CyRide. Thanks to everyone for extending a warm welcome to all who have been hired in the last few weeks. There will be many more new faces before the fall schedule begins. We are looking for qualified applicants. If you know people who may be interested in working here at CyRide, encourage them to apply. Remember the referral program mentioned above! (Tom and George)

Change of Address: If you have moved be sure to fill out a change of address form. You can get these forms from the Dispatchers or on the bulletin board in the hallway by Dispatch and please return them to Dispatch after filling them out.

Thunderstorms and Tornadoes: Summer in lowa equals severe weather. During severe weather, the dispatcher will monitor radio and television broadcasts and will notify drivers of dangerous conditions. Drivers should notify the dispatcher if they must stop due to poor visibility caused by heavy rain or hail. Drivers should also call the dispatcher for instructions if a detour is required due to street flooding. In the event of winds in excess of 70 mph or a tornado the outdoor warning system will be activated, drivers should stop the bus in a safe location. Drivers should then direct their passengers to the nearest building for shelter. If no building is available, drivers should instruct their passengers to stay on the bus and remain below window level. Once the sirens have stopped, drivers should contact the dispatcher for further instructions. (Tom and George)

Windows and Roof Vents: When you return to base to park your bus at the end of your shift, please close all windows and roof vents. Also walk through your bus and pick-up any rubbish or lost items. Doing the above will make the laneworker's life easier when they clean and refuel your bus. (Rob H and Jenny)

FLEET AND FACILITIES

Jon Buss Retirement: For any employee that has worked for CyRide, you know that we have a hard time parting with our buses. While it's true that CyRide lacks the federal funding to replace our buses when they reach their useful life of 12 years, we genuinely love our vintage fleets. CyRide typically keeps our "buses" running in service for twice their useful life or over 24 years! Jon Buss is no exception retiring from CyRide after 27 ½ years on March 31 2016!



New Relief Vehicle: A new Ford Escape relief vehicle will be delivered to CyRide by the time Signals is published. The new Escape will be equipped with a rear camera, reverse sensing system, and blind spot monitoring (BLISS) to help prevent accidents. Look for the new vehicle to go into service later this summer. Facility Improvements: East end paving improvements should be complete by the 15th of June. Work continues to progress on the pit replacement project. The pit project should wrap up by the end of July. Finally, the tire maintenance area and west side of the shop are being improved with new paint. (Rich L.)
